

# **OBAMA'S EMPTY CLAIMS OF BIPARTISANSHIP**

"There has never been a time when Barack Obama has bucked the party line to lead on an issue of national importance. He has never been a part of a bipartisan group that came together to solve a controversial issue. He has never put his career on the line for a cause greater than himself. Even as a state Senator, Obama voted 'present' on controversial bills. We have seen Barack Obama forced to choose between principle and the interests of himself and his party. #### Summary:

- Supporting legislation that passes by large margins or unanimous voice vote is common and not a bipartisan profile in courage.
- A Republican like Senator Gordon Smith (R-OR) crossing party lines to vote against Republicans is bipartisanship. Barack Obama voting with the Democratic caucus on the same bill is not.
- While in the United States Senate, Barack Obama has taken partisan positions on major bipartisan efforts.
- In the United States Senate, Barack Obama consistently toed the party line and never took on his own party.
- In the Illinois State Senate, Barack Obama voted "present" instead of taking hard positions.

## Supporting Legislation That Passes By Large Margins Or Unanimous Voice Vote Is Common And Not A Bipartisan Profile In Courage:

NON-PROLIFERATION LEGISLATION: Barack Obama Co-Sponsored Legislation To Authorize "The President To Establish A Program To Provide Assistance To Friendly Foreign Countries For Proliferation Detection And Interdiction Activities And For Developing Complementary Capabilities (Program)" That <u>Passed By Unanimous Voice Vote</u>. (S. 2566, Introduced 4/6/06)

**LOBBYING LEGISLATION:** Joining <u>82 Other</u> Senators, Barack Obama Voted For The 2007 Lobbying And Ethics Reform Legislation. "Reid, D-Nev., motion to concur in the House amendment to the bill that would overhaul congressional lobbying and ethics rules for members and their staffs and require the disclosure of 'bundled' campaign contributions that exceed \$15,000 in a six-month period. Former senators would have to wait two years before becoming lobbyists." (S. 1, CQ Vote #294: Motion Agreed To 83-14: R 34-14; D 47-0; 1 2-0, 8/2/07, Obama Voted Yea)

ACCOUNTABILITY LEGISLATION: In 2006, Barack Obama Co-Sponsored Senator Tom Coburn's (R-OK) "Federal Funding Accountability And Transparency Act" Which <u>Passed By Unanimous Voice</u> <u>Vote</u>. "U.S. Senators Tom Coburn (R-OK) and Barack Obama (D-IL) today hailed the Senate's passage of the 'Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act,' a bill that will create a Google-like search engine and database to track approximately \$1 trillion in federal grants, contracts, earmarks and loans." #### <u>A Republican Like Senator Gordon Smith (R-OR) Crossing Party Lines To Vote Against Republicans</u> Is Bipartisanship. Barack Obama Voting With The Democratic Caucus On The Same Bill Is Not:

In June 2007, Gordon Smith Joined With Democrats To Vote For The 2007 Energy Bill. (H.R. 6, CQ Vote #226: Passed 65-27: R 20-23; D 43-4; I 2-0, 6/21/07, Obama Voted Yea, Smith Voted Yea)

In December 2007, Gordon Smith Joined With The Democrats And <u>85 Other Senators</u> To Pass The **2007 Energy Bill.** (H.R. 6, CQ Vote #430: Motion Agreed To 86-8: R 40-7; D 44-1; I 2-0, 12/13/07, Smith Voted Yea, Obama Did Not Vote)
